Dear Brian

I am writing today to follow up on the discussion we had regarding a request of support for our athletes at the St.Catharines Rowing Club. We are requesting from the St.Catharines Rowing Alumni Association a gift of \$2500 to support the purchase of a portable 10 foot and 20 foot tent to be used at "away regattas" when travelling with the club. The gift would also support the necessary accessories to be used in the tent to hold refreshments and other supplies.

During each club rowing season we travel off Henley Island to regattas with typically 100+ athletes and coaches. We most often travel to compete at regattas in Welland, London, Toronto Island, Saratoga Springs and Boston. Unfortunately most of these locations have little or no shelter for visiting clubs and their athletes. Rain, wind and hot and cold temperatures become a challenge for our crews when competing at these locations.

In order to provide a better experience for our athletes when travelling to these regattas we have developed a plan to purchase a tent and accessories to allow us to bring our own shelter to these locations. We have also recruited a lead volunteer parent to coordinate the set up, manning of the tent and the securing of refreshments to be supplied to the tent for each regatta. The tent will provide an easily recognized gathering place for our athletes and coaches to take shelter during inclement weather or seek out shade during those regattas when the sun and heat can become unbearable. The tent would also be used at the boathouse on Try it Days/Open Houses as well as during our St.Catharines Rowing Club hosted regattas and for other special events where this type of shelter is needed.

In recognition of this gift we would ensure that tent is designed to include the St.Catharines Rowing Alumni Association logo along with our club logo. We would also recognize this gift on our website and at the June 25th Boat and Equipment Christening. Our hope is to have secured the tent and accessories for the start of the summer competitive rowing season.

I thank you for this opportunity to present this request to the St.Catharines Rowing Alumni Association. I look forward to speaking with you further and would be happy to answer any questions you may have.


